Dropping off and collecting your child

Thank you for being prompt to drop your children off and pick them up—it makes such a difference when children are at school on time and can get away promptly at the end of the school day. Just a couple of issues we need to get sorted:

- If you are not here to collect your child by 3.45 p.m. they will go to After School Club and there will be a charge depending on what time you arrive. We need to do this as they need to be properly supervised and waiting around in the foyer is not acceptable.
- Could you please leave plenty of room by the exit doors when you collect your child? It will help us to speed up the children's exit from school and keep them safe!
- Stranger Danger! On Wednesday a small child got lost on the playground and it was upsetting and worrying for mum, especially as a man approached the child and took his hand I am sure he was just being kind to a lost child but nevertheless if you could please be vigilant and always keep your child under close supervision at all times on school premises.

Finally, I know many of you are aware there was an incident on the playground today where a child was hurt by other children. We are dealing with through the Police but please can I ask you to ensure that whilst on the playground that everyone, adults and children alike, uphold the highest standards of behaviour and respect for other members of the school community.
