Instead, we will be holding parent consultations throughout the day from 9am-12noon and from 1pm-4pm. (Teachers will be having their lunch from 12 noon—1.00 p.m.). You do not need an appointment just arrive at your child's classroom, take time to look at their work



and speak to the teacher. Every child will receive a crème egg, anti-bullying wristband and a balloon after your consultation. You must come and speak to the teacher on this day for your child to get their attendance mark.

The only way into the school will be through the front Reception where your child will receive a Programme of events which contains vouchers for a free go on the climbing wall and bouncy castle. Additional goes will cost £1 and 50p respectively.


