Year 3

Year 3 are currently experimenting with **clay**. We have been manipulating the materials and discovering different effects we can create. We used special tools for mark making into the clay and even trialled using cross hatch and water to stick pieces of clay together. The tools were also useful for smoothing down our designs. We will be using our skills again to complete our final piece which will be based on our topic of Ancient Egypt.

In Year 4, we have been comparing the **lifestyles of the Spartans and Athenians** using a VENN diagram. We discussed the similarities and differences between both city states before sorting statements into the correct categories.

Year 5 took full advantage of the sunny, spring weather to take part in **team building exercises in**PE this week. Mr Bates was there on hand to give some excellent, expert advice. In the first exercise, the two teams had to pass hula hoops around the whole group without breaking the chain.

They then collaborated to ensure no-one touched the ground while collecting a marker from a distance. Every member of the group had a part to play. This took a lot of thinking and problem solving. The session ended with some parachute activities involving the whole class working as one, well-oiled machine! Well done, everyone!










Year 6

In Year 6 we are looking at **inheritance** and how genes are passed down to offspring. We used Mr Men and Little Miss to illustrate how certain characteristics can be passed down to offspring. This helped us understand how genetic information in DNA is passed on in living things. This also helped us understand the idea of natural selection in more detail.

Breakfast Club must be paid in advance and is £1 per day and 50p for any siblings.




Local vicar comes to Thornton








School Attendance
