In July 2018 the DfE produced draft guidance for schools on the new proposals for Relationships education and Sex education. I know some parents have been worried by rumours about this new guidance (which is yet to be finalised) so can I bust some myths in the meantime?

- Only relationships education, not sex education, will be compulsory in primary schools.
- If a primary school chooses to teach sex education, parents have the right to withdraw their child (except for any sex education in the science curriculum).
- Schools will be expected to consult, and work with, parents on the development of their programmes of lessons.
- Hope that helps. Look out for news of workshops once the DFE has produced its final guidance.


