Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Working on Times Table Rockstars - your child will have an individual login to access this. Worksheets on MyMaths – there will be 5 a week so you can aim to do 1 a day. This week's focus is telling the time. Play on Hit the Button - focus on number bonds, halves, doubles and times tables. Practise telling the time. This could be done through this game (scroll down to access the game). Read to the quarter hour and the nearest 5 minutes. Play this game on Maths Frame and choose the Fractions of Numbers to link with the MyMaths work from last week. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Watch the videos of Miss Brown reading a chapter a day of <i>Mother Knows Best</i> on Thornton Primary School website. Listen to your child read a chapter of a book a day – when they have read it, can they <i>summarise</i> what the chapter was about in a few sentences? In a book your child has read, can they use the skill of <i>visualising</i> to draw what they think the setting or character looks like?

It is a very unusual place to have a house! Describe it. Can you write some speech that could happen between the boy and the girl when they meet. Watch this other clip to help you with your inverted commas. Watch this Newsround 'Football isn't doing enough for the environment'. What good things is this football club doing for the environment?

C		See if you can create a model of a landmark from Birmingham city centre: Birmingham Library Rotunda City Hall
R		Use kiddle.co to research. Watch this video of graffiti art. This is in Birmingham in a place called Digbeth. What do you like about the art? Can you research and find other places with urban art?
E		Go on google earth . Click on "Launch Earth" and then search for Birmingham, England. On the right of the page, it will have a tab that says "points of interest in Birmingham". Click on this and have a look at the different landmarks in Birmingham.
A		Look at this urban art by an artist called Banksy. Can you try and re-create this painting? Maybe change the heart balloon to something else if you wanted. Think about what art resources you could use – pencil, paint, colouring pencils.
T		Watch Newsround each day to keep in tune with what's going on in the world.
I		Using google earth again, can you find other cities in England. To do this find Birmingham like you did in the E section and zoom out a bit. Click on different places. It will say this (below) if it is a city. Which cities are the closest to Birmingham city? Birmingham City in England
V		Find the meaning of these words and write them into sentences: <i>capital city</i> <i>urban</i>
E		Explain in your own words what urban art is.
