 Working on <u>Times Table Rockstars</u> will support your child with their fluency of multiplication and division facts. Log on to <u>MyMaths</u> and complete different activities set by your teachers each day. <u>BBC</u> have a range of videos to explain different maths concepts and maths games to support children's knowledge. <u>Topmarks</u> is a maths website full of different games. Focus on addition and subtraction for this week. The <u>Oxford Owl</u> website will help you to understand different maths concepts. 	 Our new class novel is the 'Demon Dentist' written by David Walliams. Visit <u>his website</u> and chose an activity to complete. Log on to <u>Reading Plus</u> and read one book for 15 minutes a day. Site Code: rpthorn10 Create a <u>comic strip</u>. You can design your own characters, setting and problem. Listen to your child read and let them discuss what they have read. Encourage them to read with expression and intonation. Listen to <u>Chapter One</u> of the 'Demon Dentist' audio book.

 Practise the Year 3/4 for <u>Common</u> <u>Exception</u> words. Practise your spelling on <u>Spelling Frame</u> Use fronted adverbials to start sentences. <u>Spin the wheel</u> and complete the sentence. Look on the <u>BBC</u> website to remind yourself of the spelling patterns we need to use in Year 4. 	 Imagine you have discovered a treasure map. Write a diary entry about your journey to find the treasure. What dangers will you face? Who will help you on your journey? Watch the video of The Night Zoo on the Literacy Shed. Complete the different stages to plan and write your own story adventure story. Visit the Dudley Zoo website and research different species of animals. With your new knowledge, write a non-chronological report about the animals.
