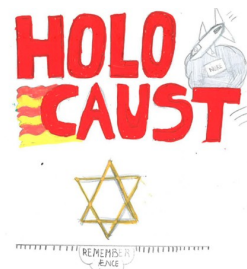

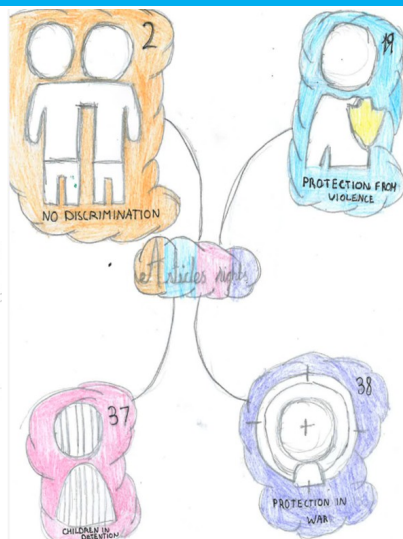

HOLocaust Memorial Day

What was the Holocaust?

The Holocaust was an event that occurred during WW2. It was when the Nazis led by Adolf Hitler, imprisoned, killed, or gassed six million Jews, and also targeted other groups of people, including Roma, LGBTQ+ individuals, and disabled people.

Why is it remembered?

It is to honour the six million Jews who have been gassed, killed, and taken to death camps. It also serves as a reminder of the dangers of racism, hatred, and discrimination.

Free support sessions for Parents and families awaiting a diagnosis of Autism from the NDP pathway.

Is your child currently on the Birmingham NDP Autism Assessment / Diagnosis waiting list?

Resources for Autism is a charity that supports parents and children with diagnoses of Autism. They are offering Free Autism Support Sessions for Parents/Carers of children and young people (up to 18 years) who are waiting for an autism assessment through Birmingham Neurodevelopment Pathway NDP service.

The sessions will look at what autism is and give information, advice, resources and strategies on navigating the system. They will also cover key topics such as sensory processing, behaviour, communication, sleep, wellbeing, and more!

The aim of these sessions is to help you build practical skills to support your child, gain confidence in advocating for their needs, safeguard yours and your family's wellbeing during the waiting period for diagnosis, and connect with others on a similar journey—creating a valuable community and peer support network. **If you would like to register your interest for these sessions, please do so at the following QR code.** The sessions may take place online or in person.
