How does the school set homework?

All children are given a Reading Diary and always have a reading book. An important part of homework is for children to take these home to read EVERY NIGHT with someone in their family—older brothers and sisters are usually very good at this! We encourage family members to write in the Reading Diary to tell us how the child's reading is going and whether they have had any problems or successes. Diaries are checked once a week by school staff and we love to read your comments to help us guide and inspire your child. Your child also has access to books from the school and class libraries which they can also bring home to read with you. We want to develop a love of reading right from the start!

In addition to reading, we also ask children to do other activities at home during the week such as practising their phonics; letter formation and handwriting; learning spellings; number bonds; times tables or doing some research for a topic. These are all important tasks that improve children's basic skills as well as giving you the opportunity to work together and get to know more about what your child needs to do to improve. Homework Diaries and exercise books are provided so that you know what your child needs to do and children can complete any tasks set in their books. Many tasks will be given at the start of term with the expectation that children will do the tasks every week and improve over the weeks, so that at the end of that time they will have mastered a basic skill, for example to learn number bonds to 20. This means that new homework won't

necessarily be sent every week but you can plan to do the homework to fit in with your busy schedules.. We need parents to take responsibility for their children's learning

over time in partnership with us to make homework effective.
