



Year 5

Year 5 allotment visit

Over the last week, children in year 5 visited St Margret's Road allotments as part of our **Allotments** topic. The children met Hester, who showed them around the plots. They planted a variety of seeds and seedlings including sunflowers, spinach and beans. The children explored the different fruits and vegetables that were growing in the allotments. They saw celery, cucumbers, potatoes and strawberries. Hester gave the children some organic strawberries to try. They enjoyed them as they were very sweet.



Year 6

As part of our Science topic: **'The Heart'**, the children took part in an experiment to see how exercise effects the heart rate of a person. The children, first, went outside and recorded their resting heart rate. They then had to engage in different exercises for 1 minute and then take their heart rate again. What the children found was that their heart rate increased after doing the high intensity exercises. However, once they had rested again, their heart rate slowly started to slow down and less beats were recorded per minute. When a person is exercising, the heart needs to work harder in order to pump the blood quick enough around the body to the organs. The children enjoyed getting some much needed fresh air to their brains and lungs!
