
Year 3



"Ladies and gentlemen, we have the next generation of orienteers right here!"




Continuing from last week, we have begun to create our still life sketches by observing real produce such as aubergines, peppers and pomegranates, and trying to recreate the detail.

At the end of Summer Term 1, the class with the best attendance will be rewarded with a £50 gift voucher to spend on new classroom resources or a VIP cinema experience.









A Message From Traffic Warden
