Yesterday, I was able to share with the pupils the results of the first round of matches in the Thornton Multiplication Times Tables World Cup. This first game lasted four days and saw huge participation. For instance, on Wednesday 23rd November 211,903 questions were answered correctly across the school. This is a significant rise from the previous Monday when 25,369 questions were answered correctly.


In our History lesson we have been looking at the key question: How was life different for different groups in ancient Greece?

We have been learning about what life was like in ancient Greece for children, men and women. We found out that children stayed at home until they were seven. Then, boys were sent to school, where they learned to read and write. They often entertained themselves by playing games like marbles, hoops or ball games. Other Ancient Greek toys they had including puppets and dolls, hobby horses, toy chariots, pull-along animals on wheels, spinning tops and even an early version of a yo-yo.

We also learned about what life was like for men. They fought in armies and took part in sports. Whereas women were taught skills that they would need to run a home such as cooking and weaving. We mind mapped what life was like for them and then shared our findings with the class.

During our Year 5 topic about the **Anglo-Saxons**, children have had an experience of using clay to make their own artefacts inspired by those found in the Staffordshire Hoard. They used a range of skills to create their prices of artwork such as rolling, and sculpting followed by painting using specific bronze, silver, and gold paint to create an overall historical effect.






Year 6

In Year 6 we have been looking at the topic of **Light** for Science. The children learnt that light can be refracted through different mediums. The medium that we explored was water. The children had to fill a glass with water and draw an arrow on a piece of paper. They had to move the glass along the picture of the arrow and see how the refraction changed the image.




