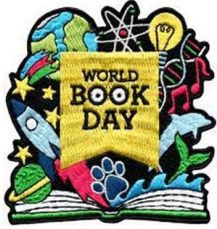

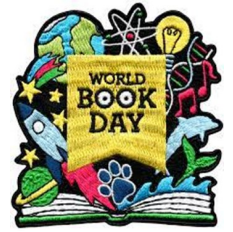

National Book Token Design Competition!

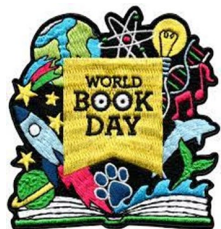

HOW TO ENTER

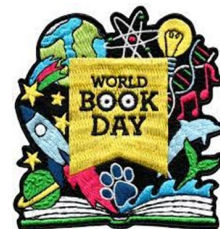

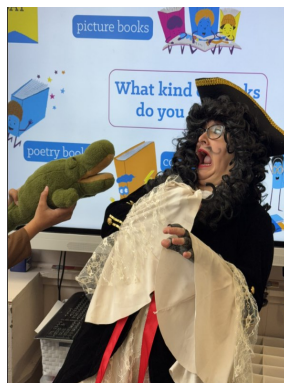


World Book Day

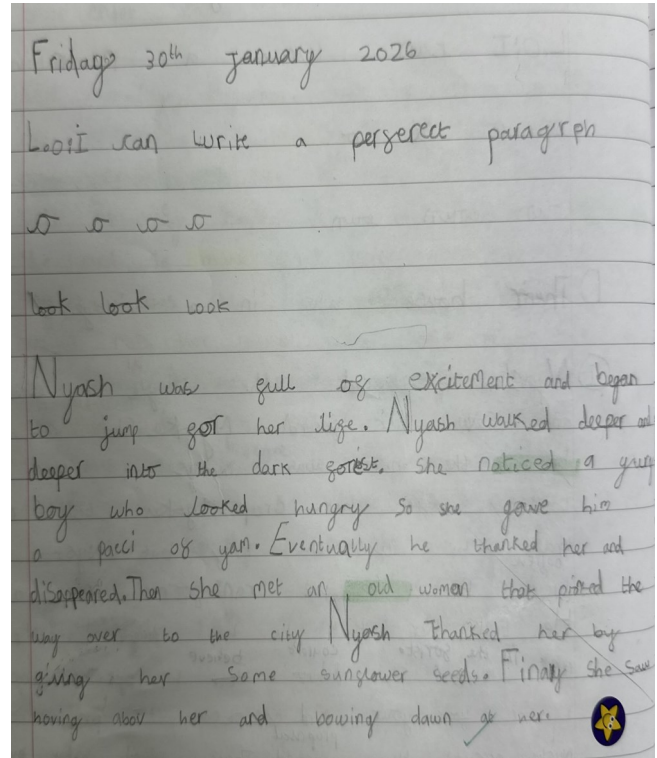
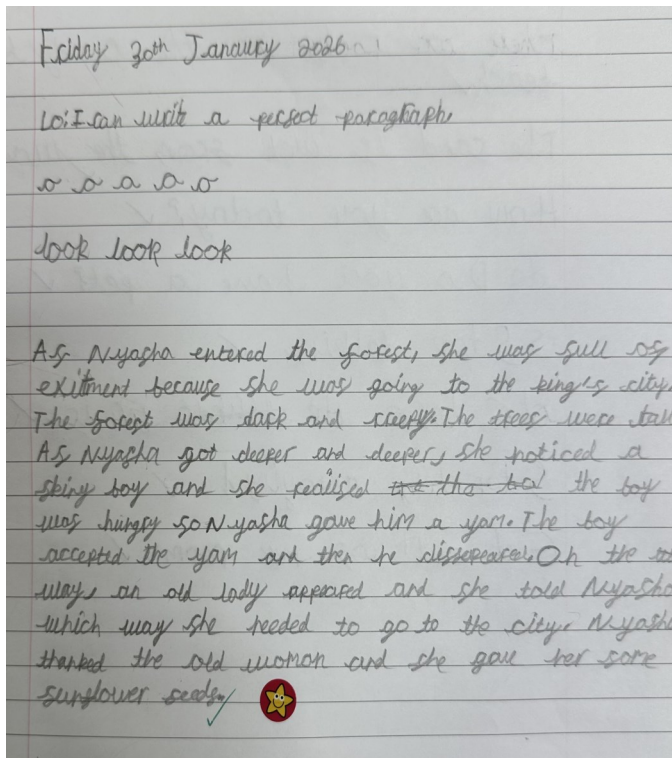

Year 4

This week in year 4 Mr Ryall stood in the assembly hall and captured everyone's attention!

Imagine you were a **Roman soldier** marching into Britain nearly 2,000 years ago! This was his hook to start the Romans topic.

He told us that the Romans invaded Britain in AD 43 and built straight roads, strong bridges and forts to control the land.

We learned that Roman soldiers lived in forts and wore armour, and that they brought things like baths, new foods and towns to Britain.

Mr Ryall's exciting hook made everyone want to find out more about how the Romans changed Britain. Now we are looking forward to starting our new topic and we have some great facts to start with!



Year 5

This week, in preparation of making our own pouches and pockets (for securing smaller items) in our D.T lessons, we used our lesson time this week **to practice a range of different stitches**. We reminisced and built on our learning in Year Three when we made our Christmas tree decorations to revise how to thread a needle and perform a running stitch. When we felt confident, we explored the usefulness and difficulties with more complex stitch patterns, such as back-stitching or a blanket stitch.

Year 6

In our writing lessons in Year 6, **we are working on a persuasive text**. Year 6 must persuade Mrs. Grace and the eco councillors that all plastics should be banned in school! The children had to watch a video and produce some research on why plastic is bad for the environment. The children had to match the pictures to the notes in the video.

Plastics are harmful, this is because when plastic is being produced, it takes a lot of energy to burn the fossil fuels to make it. This can produce a great deal of pollution, and it can release greenhouse gases into the atmosphere. This causes climate change.

⑤ These are missions which cause climate change, making the problem WORSE!

⑥ Disposing single use plastics (SUPs) are not easy. Many plastics end up in land fills where they can let out harmful chemicals into the ground.

⑦ Other plastics are burnt which releases toxic smoke into the air.

Reasons why should

④ The production of single use plastics releases greenhouse gases into the air.

⑤ Single use plastics begin with the extraction of fossil fuels such as oil and natural gas.

⑥ The raw materials are processed to create various types of plastic resin. The resin is shaped/molded into different plastic items. This process consumes many energy and creates air pollution.

⑦ Single use plastics are products that can only be used once before being thrown away.

⑧ Some plastics waste ends up in the ocean, where it harms the sea creatures threatening eco systems.

⑨ Some plastics are not biodegradable. Some plastics can even take hundreds of years to break down. Animals can mistake the plastics for food, choking on them or get trapped in the plastic.

⑩ These products have been found in the post chain, which can cause health.
