


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
Year 3

In PSHE this week, Year 3 have been looking at **loneliness** and the affect it has on **our mental health**. We looked at how we can recognise loneliness in others and how we can help them tackle loneliness. Year 4

Present new: What are **tone**, **tints** and **shades**?

Tone:


Tone is the lightness or darkness of something, and allows us to see how light or dark a colour is. It also means tone could be a shade.

Tints:

Tints is where an artist adds white (or grey) to a colour. This allows you to create a lighter colour.

Shades:

Shades is where an artist adds black to a colour. This allows you to create a darker colour.




Year 5

Year 5 have been studying the culture of **Ancient Benin**. Craftspeople from Benin were expert bronze casters and made beautiful masks and ceremonial busts. Year 5 tried making our own masks. Rather than set fire to the school, we decided to reuse waste cardboard and make relief models.

Some children were confused by the facial features and good discussion was had on how we get used to facial features we see a lot, even when they are different to each other, but notice different things about faces when

we meet people from a new place. It is our perception that is key, not the people's faces.



Year 6

This week year 6 have focused on **Commonwealth** activities. Pupils have had the opportunity to create medals representing their country, designing animated maps for their Commonwealth country and making flags. Pupils have also created wonderful fact files explaining how the Commonwealth first began and explained how their countries were involved with the Commonwealth.

Payments


Could you please ensure that all Dinner, Breakfast and Afterschool club debts have been cleared at the start of each week. If you are having any issues with payment please contact the school office for support.




Summer Term Golden Ticket Gold Award
