YEAR 5




Year 6 have been incredibly busy writing their non-chronological reports about the Victorian classroom. To ensure their report informed their audience, the children first had to carry out research. Their report included four areas: The schools the Victorian children attended, Victorian lessons, Victorian punishments and Changes to the Law which resulted in free education for all.




