
This week, we are focussing mainly on inference. Remember to use visualisation. Try to put yourself in the situation you are being asked about. Why would you do something? How would you feel?



4) What two pieces of evidence suggest that the dog had been badly treated in the past?




5) From the first paragraph, write two verbs that describe how animals move.




6) Why did the animals leave?
