Please see the final round results of the Thornton Times Tables World Cup. In the final round, classes faced each other across the school. Classes in **Year 3** competed with classes in **Year 4**, whereas classes in **Year 5** competed with classes in **Year 6**.

I've been really pleased by the number of requests I've had for score updates from pupils in the corridor, and by the number of correct answers we've had each day. For instance, each day last week we had over 100,000 correct answers on the platform, whereas on a normal school day we'd usually score around 25,000. The results were:
