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# Year 3

This week in PSHE, Year 3 looked at making healthy food choices. We discussed words we could use to describe different types of food, using our five senses (feel, see, smell, touch, taste). We also discussed foods that we eat at different times of the day. Here is example of all of the fantastic pieces of work the children have produced.



# Year 4

In Science, Year 4 are learning about changes of state and why they take place (condensation and evaporation). Children carried out the evaporation challenge, where they set up an investigation to find out which liquid would evaporate first. They made predictions and planned the investigation thinking about the variables and fair testing. We will observe over time to see what happens to the liquids.



# Year 5



This week Year 5 have carried out two scientific investigations. The first investigation question was 'What is gravity?' We used multilink cubes in stacks of one, two, three and four to test whether

a heavier object would fall faster than a lighter object. Children had great fun investigating the effects of gravity. The second investigation question was 'What happens when a crater hits the Earth or the Moon?' We wanted to find out if the height a ball is dropped from affects the depth of the crater. Children used a tray of flour, bouncy balls and a ruler to observe and

measure what happened. Children thoroughly enjoyed working in groups to carry out these investigations.



# Year 6

In Year 6, children have been looking at classification of living things within their science topic. This week they have been studying the five main groups of classification: birds, mammals, amphibians, reptiles and fish. The children completed some research on each group using the Fox's tool and presented their research to the class.

At Thornton Primary we have been practising and performing poetry to celebrate National Poetry week. Our teachers have also been performing poetry to the children their classes and during assemblies.
