Year 3

Our budding Year 3 children have been working very hard this week, to create **party bags** in their **Design Technology** lessons. Pupils started off by examining existing party bag designs by researching products that are already available on the market. Our keen researchers then planned and developed party bag designs inspired by their own creative ideas. Finally, children applied the designs from their plans to create a personalised party bag and were encouraged to evaluate the different processes of making their product.

This week in Year Six, we explored a range of electrical components to construct different types of **circuits**. Using wires, batteries (cells) and bulbs, we connected them to make a parallel and a series circuit. We then explored if these different structures would affect the brightness of the bulbs. We found that the **parallel circuit** was brighter and discussed the benefits of a parallel circuit compared to a **series circuit**.
