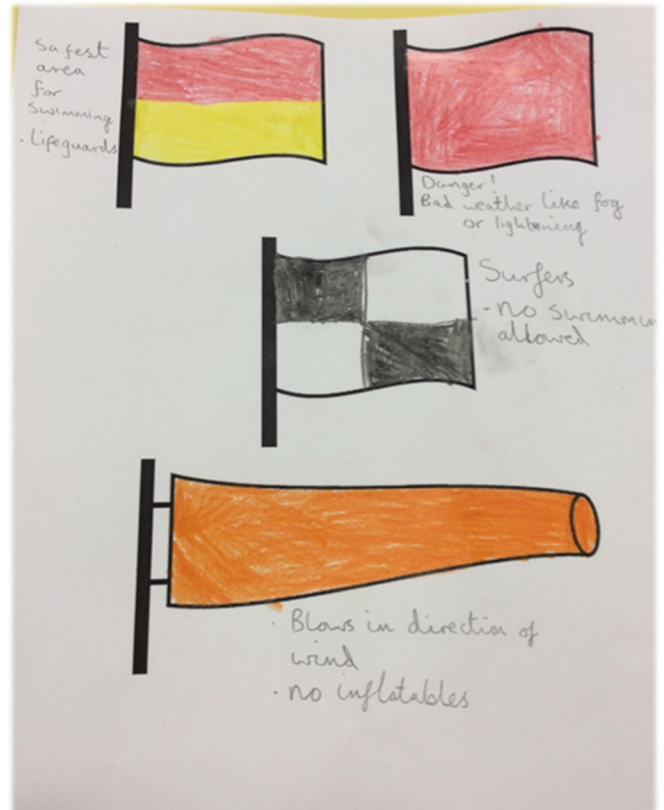
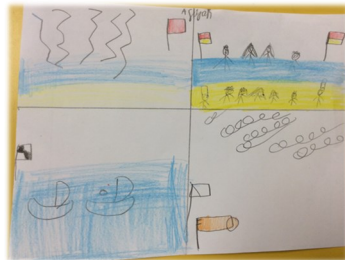
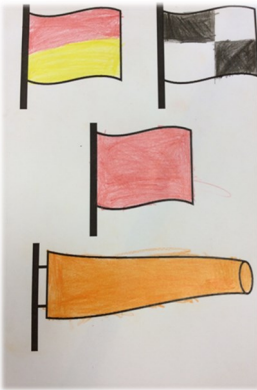


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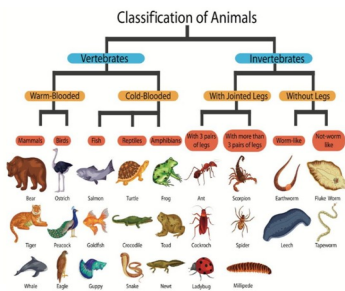
Year 3

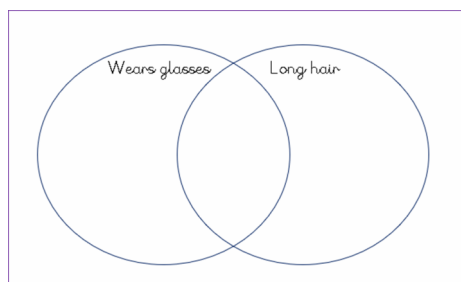
Year 4

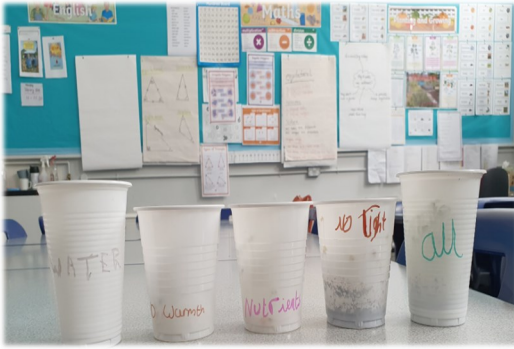

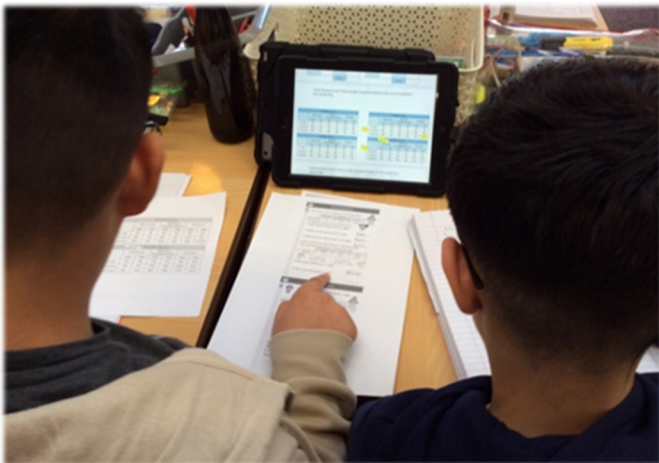

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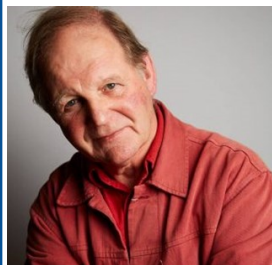




Thornton Staff Book Review

Breakfast Club must be paid in advance and is £1 per day and 50p for any siblings.

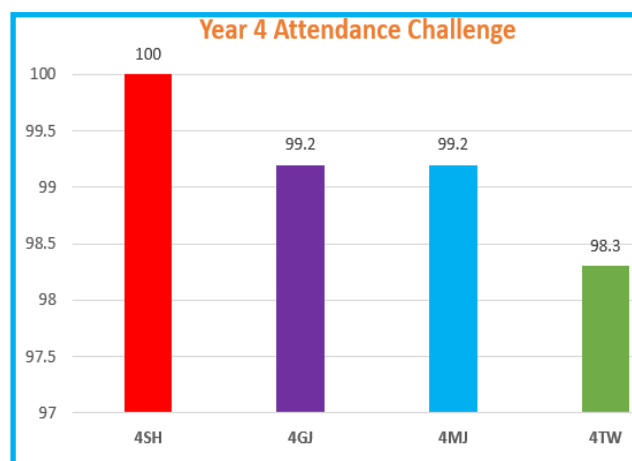
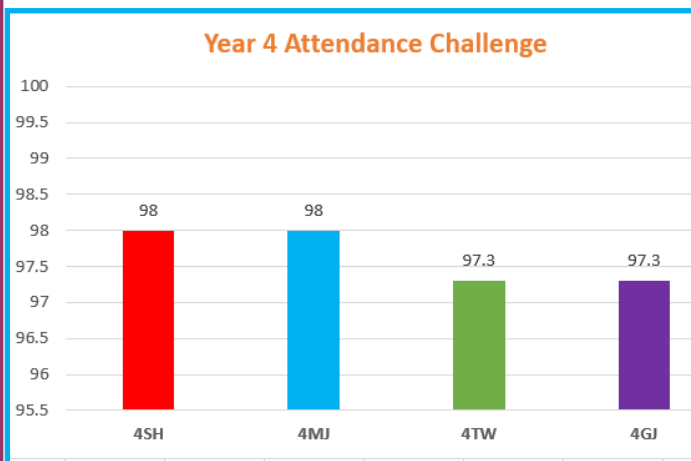
