With your child, look in magazines, newspapers and books for new vocabulary they are unfamiliar with. They could use a highlighter to highlight
Weekly Spelling Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)	in magazines and newspapers. Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)
 Practise the Year 3/4 for <u>Common</u> <u>Exception</u> words. Practise your spelling on <u>Spelling</u> <u>Frame</u> 	 Write a recount of your day, like a diary entry. This could be used in history one day to show what happened during this period. Write a character description about your
 Choose 5 Common Exception words. Write synonyms (words that mean the same), antonyms (words that mean the opposite), the meaning and an example of how to use the word in a sentence. Choose 5 Common Exception words and practise spelling them using forwards backwards. Write the word forwards then write the words backwards, e.g. forwards sdrawrof 	 favourite character from a book, film or TV show. Pick 5 random objects from your house – can you use them to create a story with and you have to include these 5 objects? <u>BBC bitesize</u> have lots of videos and lessons you can do daily.

RESEARCH	What does the word pioneer mean? Using kiddle.com, research features of a city. What makes a city a city? Also, use kiddle.com to research Urban Art. What is urban art?
CREATE MAKE	Can you create a poster about Urban Art. You can create this on paper or on the computer – get creative and explore the different types of media around the home that you could use (remember to ask an adult first!).
destgh	Can you create your own Urban Art? Maybe use chalk to create this outside or create it on paper. Make sure you take pictures to show the class if you do it outside with chalk! You could also put it on the school twitter account!
PERFORM ACT + SING + CREATE + STAGE + INSPIRE	Can you have a debate about whether graffiti is art or a crime? BBC bitesize has a good video to explain a debate— <u>https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zxvv4wx/articles/ztx8pb</u> <u>k</u>
Learn	Using kiddle.com, search for the poem— <i>Last night, I saw the city breathing.</i> See if you can learn a verse of this poem off my heart, or more
Mylife MyChoice	Our city is Birmingham. See if you can spot any signs of Urban Art where you live. Do you think this is good art or a crime where it is?
