Year 3

In mathematics, the children have been learning about time by exploring **seconds**, **minutes**, **and hours**. They have discussed the duration of various activities and applied this understanding to their own experiences. For example, estimating how many seconds it takes to brush their teeth, how many minutes it takes to eat lunch, or how many hours they spend at school. This has enabled them to make meaningful connections between time and everyday routines. During lessons, they have also utilised clocks to develop their ability to tell the time. The children engaged enthusiastically throughout these activities and have gained a solid understanding of time concepts.



Year 4

Year 4 have produced fantastic writing using the pictures from **David Weisner's book Flotsam**. The book contains illustrations of underwater life with no text to accompany them.

The children have shown their excellent understanding of drafting sentences with singular possession. Well done, Year 4!





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Year 5

Year 5 have just started work on Topic 6, looking at farms and growing, as well as where our food comes from.

The work on the topic actually started in November when children planted peas and broad beans. Last term, more seeds were planted and Year 5 now have coriander, radishes, lettuce, carrots, chives, tomatoes and rocket growing.



We have already sampled the delights of sweet, fresh peas straight from a sun warmed pod and are hoping to enjoy more produce as it comes into season to harvest.

Year 6

In Topic this week, Year 6 looked at the **main events that occurred in Mary Anning's life**. The children had to read Anning's life events and choose 6 events that they were important and arrange them on a timeline. The children then had to discuss what key moments they considered important in Mary Anning's and Charles Darwin's life. Please take a moment to have a look at some examples below:
