Year 3








Year 6



- 3. Make sure your child **gets to bed on time** and set your alarm 10 minutes earlier.



Absence disrupts the education of not only your child but the whole class. Thank you in advance for working in partnership with us to make every day count in your child's education.

This table shows just how much learning time a child with low attendance may miss:

Attendance for academic year	Number of days absent	Approximate number of weeks absent	Number of lessons missed
90%	19 days	3.8 weeks	95 lessons
80%	38 days	7.6 weeks	190 lessons
70%	57 days	11.4 weeks	285 lessons
