We came up with some things we can do to stay safe online. These are some of our ideas:

- Make sure you do not share any personal information
- Protect your passwords
- Being careful with typing in what you are searching for
- Being careful with the type of pictures and posts you post online, as once it is on the internet, it cannot be taken down!

## Year 6

In year 6 this week, as part of Anti-Bullying Week, the children had to create posters on how to prevent and deal with bullying.

We had discussed the different types of bullying especially **cyber bullying**. We talked about how everything we do online leaves a digital footprint, and how important it is to report any online concerns to an adult.
