#### **Covid-19—increase in spread of Delta variant**

As you will be aware, Birmingham is seeing a steady increase in the rise of the Covid-19 Delta variant being spread and is now an area of enhanced support. We have been advised by the Local Authority that our school is in one of the 15 focus areas across the city where daily case rates are higher, and where testing and vaccine rates are lower. In order to keep everyone in our community safe, it is essential we do everything we can to minimise the spread of the virus. #### Year 3


The children in Year 3 have been very busy with sports day this week! The children thoroughly enjoyed themselves, and took part in racing, javelin and speed bounce.












Well done to the following classes who achieved our school Attendance target of 97% and above last week


We loved your work on World Water Day. It was great that the whole school got involved in such a great range of activities around this important environmental theme.








#### **Secret City Arts**

During this session pupils were also encouraged to think about these questions,


'What might a tree within an urban setting say to another tree?'
