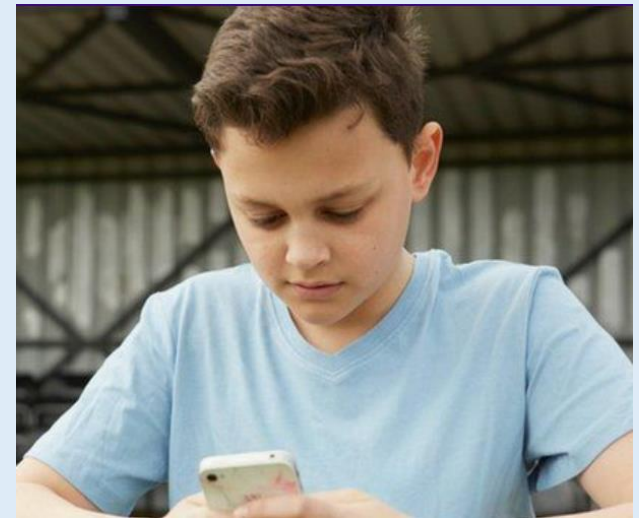

# Advice and tips about internet safety.

Remember: social media sites come with an age restriction and there is a reason for that. So, before going onto a site check the age limit.

If a stranger sends you an invite to become friends, decline the invite.

If you receive online abuse such as cyber bullying and hurtful comments, you must tell a responsible adult and make the social media site aware by reporting it.

If you have any concerns with your online safety then please tell a parent or teacher. You mustn't suffer in silence.

Newsround try to get in touch with some of the social media companies and this was the response they received:

What do the social media companies say?

- Snapchat wouldn't speak to Newsround about the survey.
- Instagram wouldn't do an interview but told us: "Keeping the community safe on Instagram is our number one priority and we spend a lot of time thinking about it... we require anyone on Instagram to be over the age of 13".
- YouTube wouldn't do an interview either, but stressed that the site is for people aged 13 and over.
- And Facebook said they'd be happy to do an interview as long as we didn't ask them about under 13s, which we wouldn't agree to. (Why do you think Facebook refused to answer about under 13s?)
