WE took the decision many years ago to declare our school a **'nut-free' school**. Therefore, we are asking for everyone's support in making sure that they do not send any food into school that contains nuts. This includes items in lunch boxes for children that bring a packed meal, as well as breaktime snacks and sweets and chocolates shared on special occasions. The severity of some children's reaction to nuts can be life or death situation and we need everyone to work with us to keep all of the children safe. Thank you in advance for your support with this.

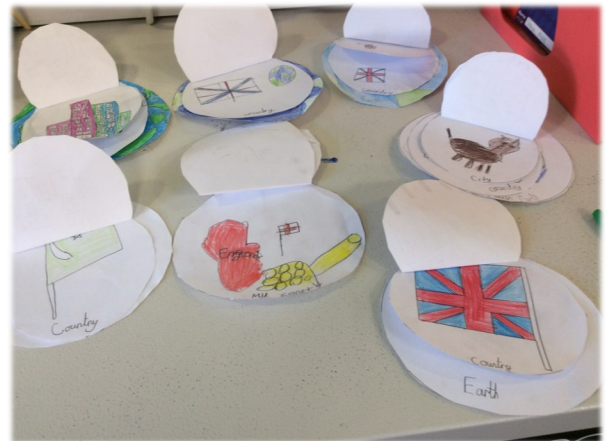

Year 3

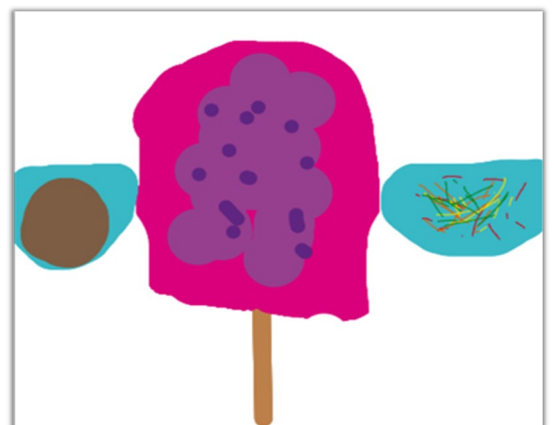
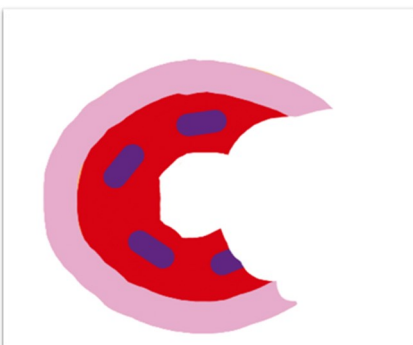
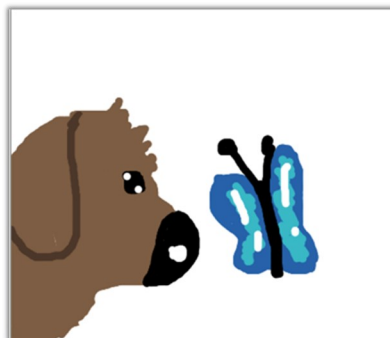

Year 4

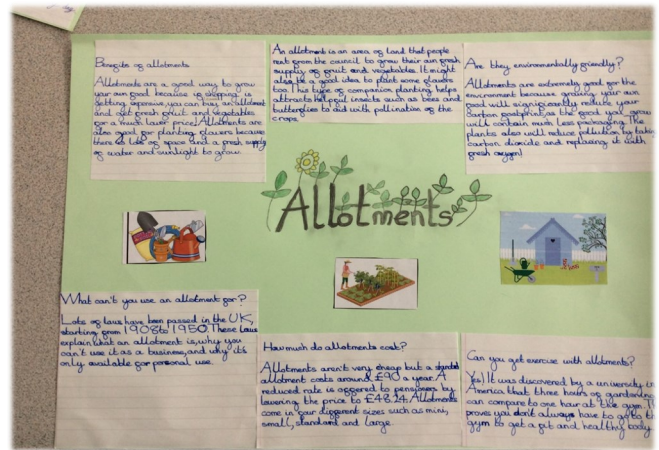
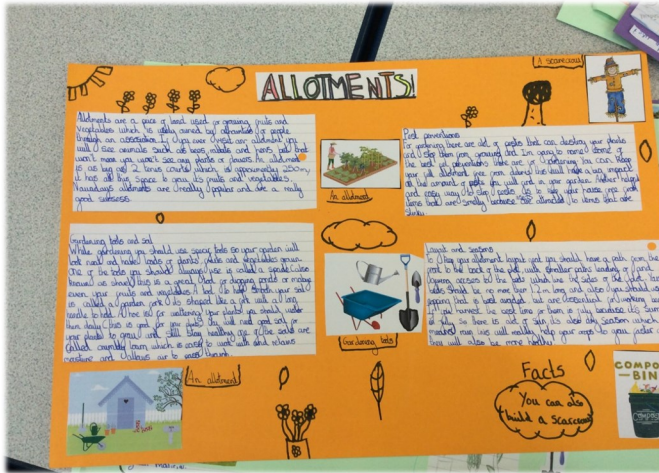
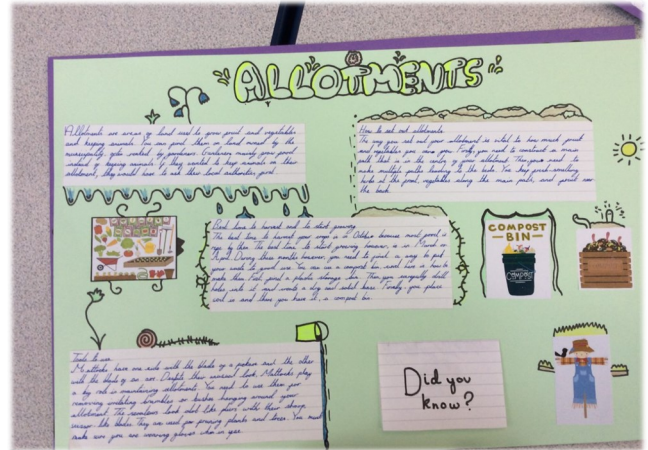

Year 5 are eagerly awaiting their visit to the allotments which is coming up soon! They will not only get to see the place but will also have opportunity to plant something.

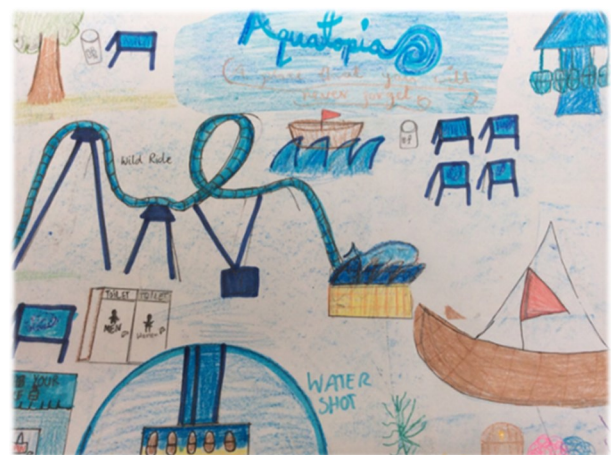


Year 6

Payments

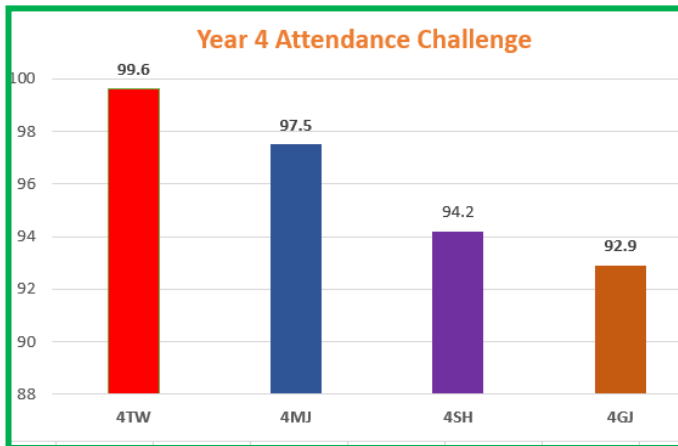


Could you please ensure that all Dinner, Breakfast and Afterschool club debts have been cleared at the start of each week. If you are having any issues with payment please contact the school office for support.
