


Children wrote the names of their trusted adults at Thornton Primary that they can go to when they feel worried. Everyone has someone to share with.



National Book Token in their winning design for every child in their class... and the opportunity to spend them in a visit to a local bookshop!


HOW TO ENTER



The children enjoyed manipulating the clay and using tools to create individual brooch designs using lines and shapes.





Year 5

In Year 5's **Design and Technology** lessons, children are exploring how buildings around the world are made **earthquake proof**. They had an extremely exciting lesson creating very basic structures out of old newspapers! These were then tested with a whole lot of shaking to see which group made the sturdiest one! During their follow up lesson, the children have learnt about two distinct types of quake-proof designs: tuned mass dampers and base isolation. They are currently in the planning stages of making their own towers using strips of wood. Will we have the next generation 5BA's paper maquettes of architects and structural engineers? 
Year 6

Juan Travieso is an artist based in Miami and New York. His work explores notions of impermanence and decay through a combined language of pop, realism, and abstraction.


Figures, be them humans or animals, are broken up into spaces and forms much like 3D models, speaking to both their temporality and transition into the digital age.

Pupils have had the opportunity to create observational drawings of animals to kick start the unit.


