We were delighted that 99% thought the school is taking satisfactory measures to help keep the children covid-safe.

We have also been listening to music from a variety of genres. Last week was Bollywood with Jai Ho! and this week Funk with James Brown (I feel good!).













Year 6




Dinner money must be paid in advance and is £2.40 per day and £12.00 per week.
