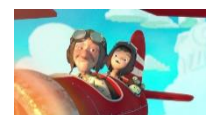
Weekly Maths Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Working on [Times Table Rockstars](#) - your child will have an individual login to access this.
- Worksheets on [MyMaths](#) – there will be 5 a week so you can aim to do 1 a day. This week's focus is **statistics**
- Play on [Place Value Basketball](#) –recap your knowledge on place value.
- Watch this [ChuckieMaths](#) clip to recap how to read a simple bar chart
- Play this game on [Maths Frame](#) and test your knowledge of properties of 3D shapes to link with the shape topic from last week.



Weekly Reading Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Watch the videos of Miss Brown reading a chapter a day of *Mother Knows Best* on [Thornton Primary School website](#).
- Watch the short film [Taking Flight](#). Can you summarise the key points of the story?
- Make a list of *questions* that you would ask the boy at the end of the story to find out more.
- In a book your child has read, ask them to identify 2 new words. Then use a [dictionary](#) to find the meanings together.

Weekly Spelling Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Practise the [rule](#) for spelling words with the suffix -ly.

Colourful words: Use two different coloured pens to write out your spelling words. Use one colour for the consonants and one for the vowels.

e.g. *usually basically*

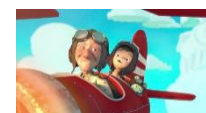
Finger tracing: Use your finger to write out a spelling word on someone's back. They need to guess the word. Now it's their turn to write on your back, and your turn to guess!



- Play the [segment puzzle](#) game on [Spelling Frame](#) to help you learn your spellings, then complete the spelling test.

Weekly Writing Tasks (Aim to do 1 per day)

- Watch the short film [Taking Flight](#) again. This time, record as many interesting adjectives and [verbs](#) that you can think of as you watch the story.
- You can view a list of '[awesome adjectives](#)' here to help you.
- Retell the story from Grandpa's point of view. Don't forget to plan your story first! Use this [clip](#) for support.
- Your story will be in first person. Click on this [guide](#) to remind you what this looks like, then make a list of all the first person pronouns.
- When you write your story, think about what he can see, hear and feel at different parts of the story. Try to use the vocabulary that you recorded before, to add more detail.
- Once you have completed your story, you need to check in makes sense. Here's how to [proofread and identify errors](#).



Creative Homework – choose an element to do throughout the week

Creative homework aims to provide opportunities for your child to gain a better understanding of their new Topic that they will be studying. Learning may focus on the different areas of the curriculum and provides your child with the flexibility to lead their own learning. They are in control of the direction they wish to follow on their journey to make new and exciting discoveries... Summer 1 Topic – Urban Pioneers

C		Urban artists often create art about where they live, and their experiences and feelings about it. Think about your local neighbourhood. Think about the buildings, the people and the community. Create a wall mural or painting to represent your neighbourhood. You can use pictures, words and patterns.
R		Look through the Ward End and Hodge Hill local history website, and look at the pictures to see how important areas of Ward End have developed and changed over time.  
E		Find Ward End on Google Maps . Scroll around the map and try to find your road and your school. How many places can you find that you recognise? E.g. parks, shops, places of worship. Could you create your own treasure map? Or you could produce some directions for somebody new to the area.
A		Have a go at sketching the Library of Birmingham using pencil. Think about the types of lines and patterns you will include in your sketch. Use kiddle.co to find pictures of the library. 
T		Watch this video of Birmingham by night . Think of all the different sources of light that help to illuminate the city. Could you create your own podcast or radio show explaining to people who do not know Birmingham?
I		Use PowerPoint to share the information you researched about Ward End in the R section. Be as creative as possible, you may add some videos, images or even some animation. You can present your findings to your family members! 
V		Use the online dictionary to find the meaning of these words and write them into sentences. <i>local</i> <i>experiences</i> <i>illuminate</i> Are you able to produce your own glossary for your Power Point? 
E		Write a short paragraph explaining what you love about your local area. Why is it important to you? You could pretend you are a television presenter and produce your own show?
