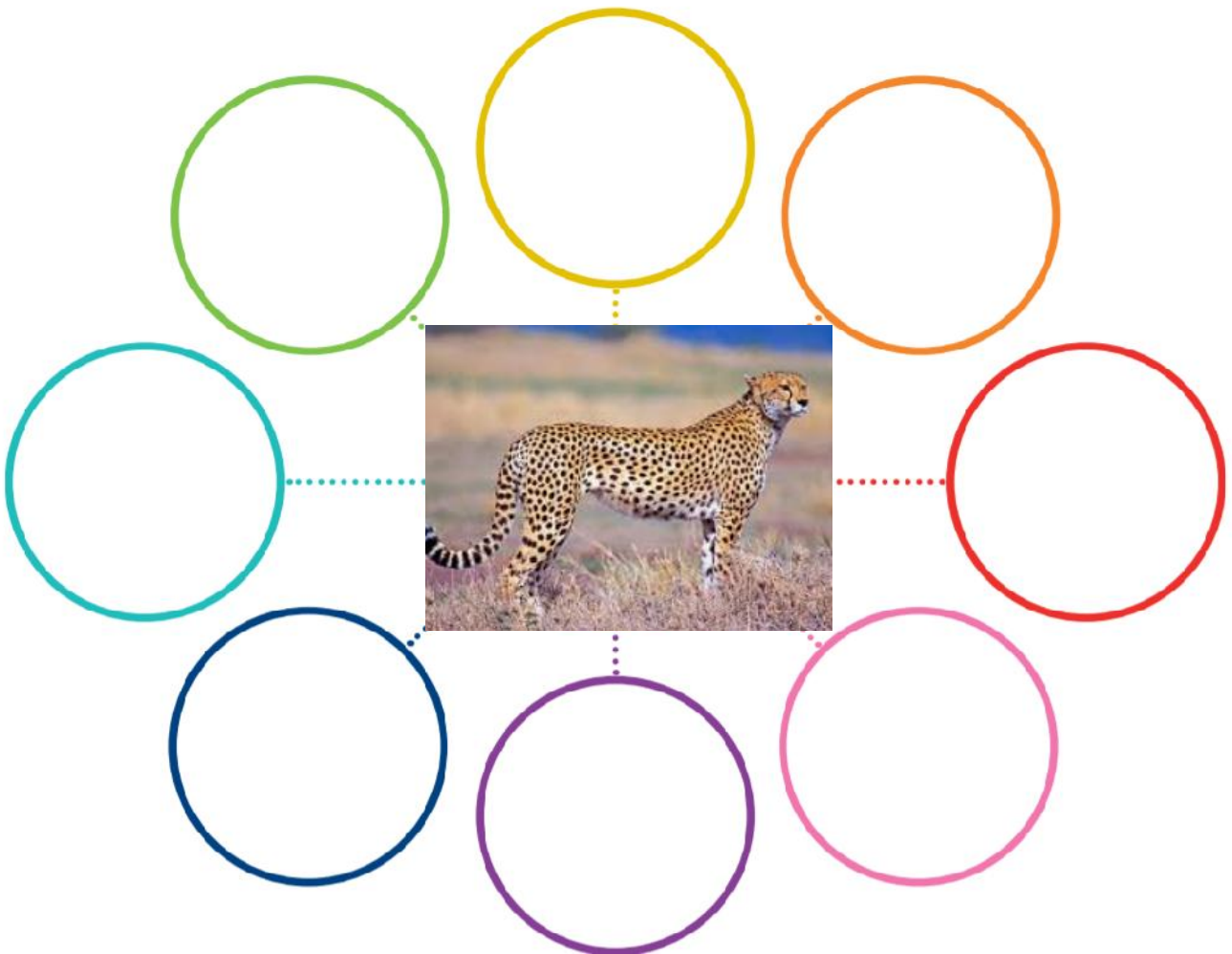

An adverb is something that tells you where, why or how something is done. Many adverbs end in -ly but **not all of them**. Similarly, not all words which end in -ly are adverbs.

Some example:

There was a small cat inside the box.

Inside is the adverb because it is telling the reader where the cat is.

Always have breakfast because it helps you throughout the day.

Always is the adverb because it is telling you why.

Jack ate quickly so he could play football.

Quickly is the adverb because it is describing how something is done.

Hamza walked to the park early in the morning.

Is early an adverb? It has ly. Some words may have ly but they are not

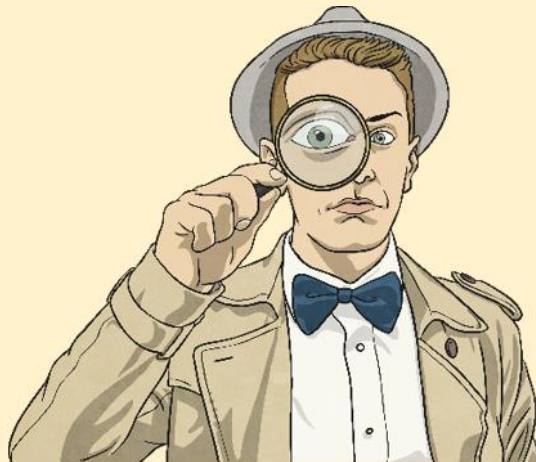
Activity 3 - Identify the adverbs in the paragraph
