NSPCC on our Christmas Jumper Day!


As we begin the holidays, I would like to remind you that the children can enjoy preparing for next term's learning by choosing activities listed in their creative homework (stuck into their


Pupils in year 6 watched Cel Spellman kick start off this year's UNICEF campaign with a special message about Mental health.






School Attendance


Autumn Term 2 Year 3 Attendance
