As well as this, members of the Senior Leadership Team and Inclusion Team are always available at the start and end of the school day and are located on the school gates on both Thornton Road and St.Agatha's Road (I am always on the gate on Thornton Road nearest the main Reception so I can be easily accessible to everyone).

Parents' Coffee Morning

Thank you to all the parents who were able to join us for our first coffee morning. It was lovely to see so many of you, and to learn how you have found the start of the school year. The event also provided an opportunity to share information.

The senior leadership team introduced themselves, and provided parents with an explanation as to their roles in school. Mrs Grace explained how the school are continuing to take precautions to minimise the spread of Covid; demonstrating that the team at Thornton are putting pupil safety first. An explanation was also given as to why the school has decided to hold virtual parents' evenings. Mrs Grace urged parents to provide the school with any feedback (good and bad) as to how you find the event, particularly as we have never held such an event before.

Parents also raised a number of important points, and asked some very thoughtful questions. They requested more support in regards to E-Safety, which has become an increasing challenge for all parents as technology has advanced. In the coming months we hope to hold a series of E-Safety workshops for parents to support you in this area. Mental Health was also raised as a concern. Mrs Biddle-Rawbone explained parents that the school has two mental health first aiders who are able to support pupils in moments of need, and that as a school we take our responsibility in regards to supporting pupils in this area extremely seriously. 


WOW! The school pumpkin has grown into a giant! It has taken six months for the tiny seed to become a big pumpkin.


Black Culture Week in Year 3





Black Culture Day in Year 4

On Monday 4th October, Year 4 focused on the work of a black artist called Jean-Michel Basquiat. We discussed his artwork and used vocabulary cards to describe his work. Then we created a checklist of things to include in our own artwork. We identified that Basquiat was inspired by Jazz music, skulls, skeletons, cartoons and writing.



We created our own artwork inspired by Basquiat by building up an abstract background while listening to **Jazz music**. Scan the QR code to listen to the music. Then we layered different materials, images, words and colours.

YEAR 5

Year 5 have been looking at the inspirational work of Willard Wigan, an artist from Wolverhampton, who has the Guinness World Record for the smallest sculpture.

We have used paper crafting techniques to make models of ancient Greek characters.

We then switched media to try the same techniques with metal foil.

Our efforts might not be as small as Mr Wigan's, but, with the help of a large needle, we did get some to fit inside the eye!



Year 6

This week Year 6 have been reading a book called Oliver Twist, which was written by Charles Dickens. The book is about a young orphan boy who is taken care of by the evil and untrustworthy Fagin. Oliver embarks on an adventure which is filled with misfortunes and at times luck. The children have been writing diary entries from the perspective of Oliver.

31st January 1871
