Parents' Evening Appointments

As the country continues to move forward in the stages coming out of national lockdown, we have taken the decision to maximise the safety of our community and continue to provide remote parents' evening appointments. Over the two weeks beginning 28th June and 5th July, teachers will be telephoning you to discuss your child's progress and attainment this academic year. If for any reason you are unavailable, teachers will attempt a second call on a different day after attempting to agree a mutually convenient time with you.

Please sit with your child and book an appointment slot on Google Classroom using the information leaflet sent home with your child. If you experience any problems doing this, please ask your child's teacher at home time, or telephone the school for help 0121 327 0824. Thank you.

Unfortunately, we are seeing a rise in school of people displaying symptoms linked to Covid-19. We understand your frustrations in being unable to send your child to school if they are displaying one of the recognised symptoms, but it is essential your child takes a PCR Covid-19 test if they do display one of the recognised symptoms, and only return to school when they receive a negative test result. This is to ensure we keep everyone in our community safe. There is information on the school website to help you which guides you through the steps to take if you know someone in your household has Covid-19 symptoms.









Year 4

People lived in the United States long before the arrival of Christopher Columbus and the Europeans. These people and cultures are called Native Americans.


If someone or something is "native," it is born, raised or from one particular place. When thinking of people as native, it can help to think of them as the first or original, indigenous habitants of a place.





We write to advise that parents can now register their child for the optional entrance test by applying online before **4pm on 30th June 2021**. The test will take place on **11th September 2021**.


